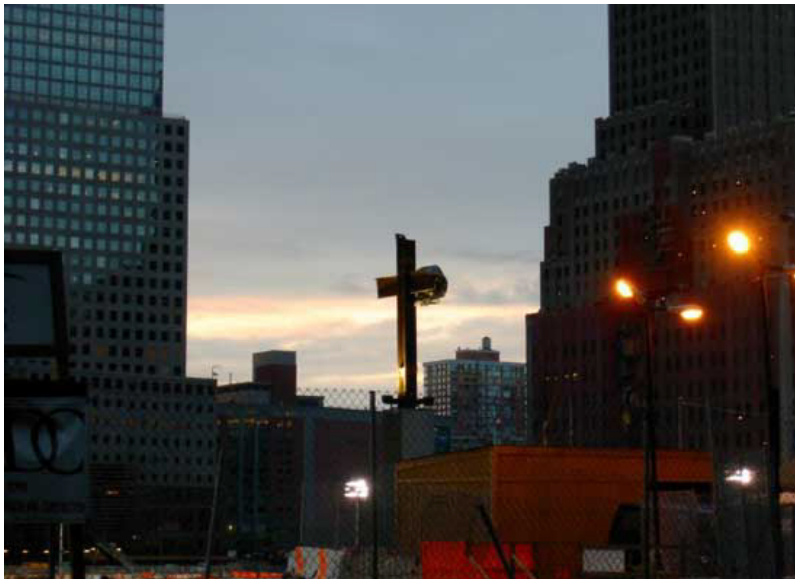

The events of September 11, 2001 deeply effected David. "This tragedy must not happen again, to anyone!" His thoughts came from within. He was inspired to redouble his efforts to further bring forward his long time interest and commitment to peace. Combining his experience in the corporate and business worlds with his awareness of living a life of service, created his focus on PeaceBuilding Through Business. The following is the background to this commitment and where it is today.

In 1983, David assisted in the development and launch of Pathways To Peace (pathwaystopeace.org) which became an NGO at the United Nations. On September 17, 1985, while at Stanford University, David led the creation of a symposium focused on the question "What is the relationship between corporations, business and peace?" This powerful and fulfilling experience inspired further meetings at 2-4 times a year. This exploration, which continued for 10 years, became known as the Peace Within Organizations Project under the Pathways To Peace (PTP) umbrella.

In 1995, surrounding World Peace Day, Avon Mattison of Pathways To Peace, and Willis Harman of The Institute of Noetic Sciences, and Director of PTP, launched the PeaceBuilding Inquiry into The 21st Century (PB21). The invited members of this extraordinary five year inquiry were business leaders and planners, educators, writers, community leaders, United Nations officials and governmental leaders.

This inquiry began with two paths. The first was a Symposium on "Peace Through Science", co-sponsored by the Institute of Noetic Sciences (IONS) and Pathways To Peace (PTP). The second was a symposium on "We The People's Initiative: PeaceBuilding Through Business", co-sponsored by PTP and the Fetzer Institute, in association with the World Business Academy. David was a key planner and facilitator throughout the 10 symposia. The five year inquiry concluded in October, 2000 and David was committed to carry this work forward with Pathways To Peace.

After September 11, 2001, David, Irene Kai and other colleagues created the PeaceBuilding.com (peacebuilding.com) web site, to further bring the exploration of PeaceBuilding Through Business into this nation's business and cultural mainstream. David has met with representatives of the United Nations, The Prince Of Wales Business Forum, business representatives and many others interested in this vital concern. This work continues.
